Welcome back to Fr David - we hope you enjoyed your holiday.

This Sunday, 22nd September, is the 25th Sunday of the Year and there is a 2nd Collection for the Diocesan Quota (at Corpus Christi only).

A reflection from Pope Francis for the Year of Prayer, for the Twenty-fifth Sunday of the Year: Let us continue the catechesis on prayer, by meditating on the mystery of Creation. Life, the simple fact that we exist, opens each person's heart to prayer. The first page of the Bible resembles a great hymn of thanksgiving. The narrative of Creation has a rhythm with refrains, where the goodness and beauty of every living thing is continually emphasized. With his word, God calls to life, and everything comes into existence. The greatness of humanity is infinitesimal when compared to the dimensions of the universe. However nothing exists by chance: by nature we are almost nothing, small, but by vocation, by calling, we are the children of the great King! Details of the First Holy Communion Programmes for 2024-25 and application forms are available after Masses this weekend at both Churches. The closing date for applications is Monday, 30th September 2024 at 5pm. The children will make their 1st Holy Communion on Saturday, 17th May 2025 in both Churches.

School admissions to Catholic Secondary Academies (Year 7) - Children born between 01/09/2013 and 31/08/2014. The deadline for submitting your application for a school place is 31st October 2024. Application forms are available on your 'home' Local Authority website. For every Catholic school you apply for if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you should also complete a supplementary information form, and return this form to the school by the deadline, (forms are available from the LA and the school). You MUST also include the supporting evidence as required with this form, eg baptism certificate (photocopies acceptable; if you do not have the evidence contact the parish where your child was baptised for a copy certificate in good time). Failure to supply the required supporting evidence will mean your child is ranked in a lower criterion which may affect your chance of a place.

The Sacred Heart Fathers & Brothers Annual Sponsored Walk will take place this year on Saturday, 28th September 2024 and is being hosted by the Community at Olton, Solihull. The start time will be 1 pm and everyone will start together. If you would like to sponsor our Nottingham Father & Brothers, sponsor sheets will be available after weekend Masses. CAFOD Harvest Fast Day is on Friday, 4th October 2024 and envelopes will be given out next weekend (28th & 29th September). How does CAFOD work? The Catholic Agency for Overseas Development (CAFOD) is part of Caritas Internationalis, a global network of Catholic charities. Caritas is the second largest development network in the world, after only the United Nations! The fundraising CAFOD receives is used to support Caritas programmes around the world. Watch out for more brief background information about CAFOD in the lead-up to CAFOD's Harvest Fast Day. The Pilgrim Virgin Statue of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and Relics of Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto will be visiting the Good Shepherd church in Nottingham, (3 Thackeray's Lane, Woodthorpe, Nottingham, NG5 4HT, www.goodshepherd-arnold.org.uk/), on Sunday 13 October 2024. The day, which is organised by the World Apostolate of Fatima England and Wales, will include a Procession with Mass at 9:45 am. There will also be Veneration of the Relics of Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto, a Film on Fatima, Recitation of the Rosary, and a Holy Hour. These relationships foster the unity of the Church by creating bonds between the Christian communities involved. There is a need to focus on the conditions necessary to ensured that priests who come to the aid of churches needing clergy are not providing merely a functional solution but represent a resource for the growth both of the Church that sends them and the Church that receives them. Similarly, it is necessary to ensure that economic aid does not degenerate into the mere provision of welfare, but also promotes authentic evangelical solidarity and is managed transparently and reliably.
